

Brown Bears, Black Bears, Polar Bears

Black Bears

- 150-400 pounds, smaller than grizzlies
- Variety of colors: brown, cinnamon, pale yellow (spirit bear), black
- Will not kill you with one swipe of its paw, usually

Brown Bears also know as Grizzlies

- 220 to 1500 pounds
- Responsible for more human fatalities
- Hump behind head sagittal crest
- Brown bear on the coast, Grizzly bear inland
- Salmon v. berries






Brown Bears, Black Bears, Polar Bears


Polar Bears

- Largest land carnivores in the world
- Adult males 500-1500 pounds
- Live in the Arctic
- Will actively seek and pursue humans
- Very fast, good eyesight, good sense of smell, good swimmer
- Top of the food chain, very dangerous



Lake Clark National Park

- Second least visited National Park
- 100 miles southwest of Anchorage
- On the Cook Inlet
- Access by boat or plane, not by car
- Home of spectacular beauty
- And a large concentration of Brown bears



Clamming

- Sows with cubs converge for salmon and clams
- July, August






Searching for Clams




Just Fishing








- Bears and anglers share the brook






Rule for Grizzlies

Always keep at least one tourist between you and the bears



Polar Bears, Kaktovik, Alaska

- Northern shore of Alaska near
 the eastern border on Beaufort Sea
- Inupiate population of about 300 native Americans
- Granted subsistence harvesting of 3 bowhead whales
- Special relationship with the polar bears the largest land predator (actively hunt humans)
